





Congratulations to Dr. Hewitt and Dr. Dolezel on receiving an external grant from the Texas Society of Allied Health Professions to conduct a study that will explore whether moral intensity and moral disengagement influence healthcare professionals' ethical decision making in a healthcare setting. Drs. Hewitt and Dolezel will survey healthcare professionals through Amazon Mechanical Turks. The survey includes several scenarios that describe ethical dilemmas faced when accessing Protected Health Information electronically, including logging in for another individual and using a personal device when accessing health records.

BSHIM Programs

- BS in Health Information Management (since 1976)
 - —Accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Health Informatics and Information Management Education (CAHIIM)
 - -Built-in Minor in Health Informatics (no additional coursework required)
 - -Professional practice experience assignments available in a variety of settings
 - New clinical sites and preceptors are constantly needed!
 - —On campus Round Rock Campus
 - -Fully online available anywhere!
 - Same cost as in-state
 - –Normally a 2+2 program (some choose part-time)
 - Freshman/Sophomore general education at TXST or a Community College
 - Junior/Senior years at TXST in the BSHIM Professional Program
 - HIT Progression: 2 years following all general education
 - -5 courses waived with CAHIIM-accredited HIT programs or HIT credential







MHIM Programs

- Master of Health Information Management (since 2015)
 - -The only HIM master's degree in Texas
 - –Accredited by CAHIIM
 - -Fully online, same cost regardless of Texas residence
 - -Health Informatics and Data Analytics Concentration
 - -Healthcare Information Security Concentration
 - –No GRE required!
 - —Thesis or non-thesis options
 - -PPE Project may be on-site or remote
 - Determined by clinical coordinator based on student circumstances
